Back in 1954, a man named Ray Kroc discovered a small burger restaurant in California and wrote the first page of our history. From humble beginnings as a small restaurant, we're proud to have become one of the world's leading food service brands with more than 36,000 restaurants in more than 100 countries. Ray Kroc wanted to build a restaurant system that would be famous for providing food of consistently high quality and uniform methods of preparation. He wanted to serve burgers, fries and beverages that tasted just the same in Alaska as they did in Alabama. To achieve this, he chose a unique path: persuading both franchisees and suppliers to buy into his vision, working not for McDonald's but for themselves, together with McDonald's. He promoted the slogan, "In business for yourself, but not by yourself." His philosophy was based on the simple principle of a 3-legged stool: one leg was McDonald's franchisees; the second, McDonald's suppliers; and the third, McDonald's employees. The stool was only as strong as the three legs that formed its foundation.



McDonald's crew members work in the kitchen of the company. The primary responsibilities of the crew members include food preparation, customer service, hygiene, and cleanliness. They see to it that every guest will be treated fast and in a friendly manner. It is part of their responsibilities to maintain the restaurant's purity and make it always inviting for friends, families, and their fellow employees. There are times when they are in the front counter to tend to the needs of the customers. Also, some of them work drive-through.

### HOUSING & TRANSPORTATION

*Host Employer assists with housing, and it will be a Condo.*

- **Housing** is not required for the job placement but there may be a penalty if you move out early.
- **Participants** will be required to sign a housing agreement. By signing the program information guide and/or housing agreement, participants are agreeing to stay at housing that has been pre-arranged for the entire length of the agreement.
- **You** will be required to make initial housing payments upon arrival, which could include security deposit & setup fee. After that time, housing will be paid bi-weekly through payroll deduction.
- **Any** damage to the property will result in participants paying the cost as determined by the housing management.
- **Detailed** housing arrangement will be disclosed by GEC prior to arrivals.
- **Housing** cost is \$450 per month (paid as \$225 through bi-monthly payroll deduction). This is based on 6-person occupancy.
- **Your** Host Employer will assign rooming lists based on arrival/departure dates and specific roommates may not be guaranteed.
- **When** offered the placement, by signing the Work Agreement and Program Information Guide, exchange visitors assume responsibility to read the housing rules and abide by all terms and conditions.
- **Various** Transportation options available and might include Public Transportation, Taxi/Shuttle Service, & Ride Share (Uber/Lyft).

### PARK CITY, UTAH

Park City lies east of Salt Lake City in the western state of Utah. Framed by the craggy Wasatch Range, it's bordered by the Deer Valley Resort and the huge Park City Mountain Resort, both known for their ski slopes. Utah Olympic Park, to the north, hosted the 2002 Winter Olympics and is now predominantly a training facility. In town, Main Street is lined with buildings built during a 19th-century silver mining boom. In 1868, a group of prospecting soldiers stationed near Salt Lake City discovered silver in the hills surrounding what is today Park City, with sizeable strikes following shortly thereafter.

In 1872, a trio of prospectors tapped into an extremely rich silver vein in Ontario Canyon. Word of the strikes spread quickly and adventurers from around the world flocked to the area, turning the tiny camp into a boomtown. The new population soon put down roots. Wooden mining shacks were quickly constructed, the weekly Park Record newspaper was launched, and schools, churches and businesses were established. In 1884, Park City was incorporated as a town.
